

ack Benny (1894-1974) was one of the first major radio personalities to make the successful transition to television. A huge star on radio ever since his March 29, 1932 debut on Ed Sullivan's show, Jack Benny's television program premiered on CBS television on Saturday, October 28, 1950. It was to become a television classic, an enormously popular program which remained on the air for 15 years.



Jack Benny was born, Benjamin Kubelsky, on February 14, 1894, Valentine's Day, at Mercy Hospital in Chicago, Illinois. He was raised at 224 South Genesee St. in Waukegan, Illinois.
